## Details of e-mails received from County Councillor Peter Schwier, since the May PC meeting

Regular e-mails have been received from County Councillor Peter Schwier since the last meeting. Please find below a list of each e-mail with brief details. If you have an interest in any particular e-mail listed please let me know and I will forward the full document to you.

1. 100,000 old style street lights replaced with LED's. Essex Highways' crews have been upgrading around 1,000 lights a week and are currently finishing the upgrades in Braintree District. The upgraded LED lights save around 75% of energy compared to the older bulbs and are more efficient as they are expected to last up to 20 years. Received 16 May.

2. Highways Highlights – April and May 2023. Received 16 May and 12 June.

3. Local Essex charities to benefit from RideLondon fundraising cycling challenge on 28 May – Charities include Essex and Herts Air Ambulance, Haven Hospices, MS-UK and Headway Essex. Received 17 May.

4. Colchester to benefit from safer, greener, healthier travel infrastructure. Received 25 May.

5. ECC awarded environmental status award - The <u>Carbon Literacy Project</u> has awarded ECC with Bronze accreditation, recognising the council as a Carbon Literate Organisation. Over 250 council employees have achieved Carbon Literacy accreditation. Carbon Literacy is an awareness of the carbon costs and impacts of everyday activities, and the ability and motivation to reduce emissions, on an individual, community and organisational basis. 6. Community Initiatives Fund grants, totalling £350,000, now open for applications – Organisations can bid for up to £10,000 to help create resilient and vibrant communities as part of the ECC commitment to Level Up the County. Deadline for applications 18 August. Received 31 May.

7. ECC receive 2023 ADEPT President's Award (Retrofit – Skills). Received 1 June.

8. Ready...Steady...Go to School - Essex Library Service has a fantastic new challenge for pre-schoolers happening this summer. It will help your child to practice skills that they'll need to help them feel confident and be ready to start school in September. The challenge is running in all Essex libraries until 31 July.
